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## **Learning Links**

**Year R -** This week in Reception, we have begun our new topic on Animals: All creatures great and small. We have been considering the questions we would like to find the answers to. The children have been finding out which colours make pink - to create our pig paintings. The children have also been constructing houses out of the community blocks. Please discuss your child's favourite animal. What do they know about it? Can you find out some facts about it?

**Year 1** – Our learning in this half of the Spring term has lots of connections to Geography. We have been learning how to write letters and we have used some interesting addresses. We are looking at 'where we live' in the world and located our school using an aerial view on Google Maps. Our DT this term is all about sculpture and we used Samantha Stephenson's sculpture of 'Other' to inspire our 3D tube art. Please continue to help your child to learn their weekly spellings.

**Year 2** - This week Year 2 have started learning their words for our class assembly which is coming up shortly. We have been revisiting our previous topics and creating the script ourselves. In English, we have started looking at the story 'The Snail and the Whale'. We are going to write a newspaper report based on this story. It would be really helpful if you could look at some newspapers at home together and discuss how they are different to a traditional story. In Maths, we have started a unit on measure, and we have been comparing our heights in class. Can you remember who your tallest friend was?

**Year 3** – Year 3 have had a fantastic week starting our new topics for the half term. In Geography we began thinking about rainforests; what they are and where we may find them in the world. We got slightly confused when we found out that the Amazon was a famous tropical rainforest. Can you explain what the weather is like in a rainforest?

**Year 4** – Year 4 have been very busy this week, starting our new topics and preparing for our class assembly. In English we have started looking at Olympic themed poetry, ready to write our own next week. In Maths we have been looking at the perimeter of rectilinear shapes and polygons. Our Geography topic this half term is 'Where is Antarctica?' and we started this by looking at latitude and longitude to locate places on a map of the world. This week in Computing we learnt about the different parts of a computer. Can you tell an adult at home the names of the parts and what they do?

**Year 5** -This week in Year 5 we have started new units of work in all subjects. We looked closely at a biography of David Attenborough in English, identifying the features and researching for our own biographies. We started looking at perimeter and area in maths and started investigating different types of energy in Geography. Can you tell an adult how you would work out the perimeter of a square if you only know the measurement of one side?

**Year 6** – The children have returned this week eager to learn. In their writing lessons they have planned for their own suspense narrative using speech, emotive language and fronted adverbials. They are continuing with dividing and multiplying decimals by 10, 100 and 1000 in Maths. During Science they have been selecting the appropriate materials to make an electrical circuit and identifying symbols. Thank you to all of you that came and watched our class assembly on Tuesday, despite a few nerves the children did amazingly. Can you tell an adult 3 facts about oceans?



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
