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Learning Links

Year R - This week we have been busy doing Easter activities including making Easter baskets and having an Easter egg hunt. We also went on a mini beast hunt and enjoyed meeting our new teacher. Have a lovely Easter holiday!

Year 1 – It was lovely to meet so many of you last week and discuss what's going well and next steps during Parents' Evening. Home support is improving every week, and the consolidation of reading is certainly showing in their writingso thank you. They've finished spring shape poetry and acrostic poems and are demonstrating creative flair. Volume and Mass was a successful unit during Maths and all have a good understanding of this now. They're developing their sculpture skills and these look so effective on display in class. They are loving Forest School and we've had a lively, fun Easter egg hunt too. We kept a weather diary throughout the week and have compared their daily entries. I have really enjoyed seeing the class mature and grow this term and am looking forward to another term. Please don't forget the museum trip on the second day back. Have a wonderful Easter break!

Year 2 - Here we are at the end of another term and what a term it has been! I have noticed such a difference with the writing the children are now producing. The children are now using adjectives, similes and metaphors in their writing which all make a huge difference to the quality of their writing. The children have all made huge progress in their 'Athematic Friday' scores which again we are all very proud of. This week we have finished our Geography unit and we are looking forward to moving on to our History unit all about monarchs. We hope you have a fantastic break and we look forward to seeing you when we return.

Year 3 – Year 3 have had fun this week finishing off their learning about Rainforests by linking their learning to how we use the woodland ourselves. We have also been enjoying our guitar lessons. This week the children have been finishing off composing their tunes and enjoying performing these to their friends. Can your child tell you the name of the guitar strings?

Year 4 – Year 4 have been very busy working on fractions in Maths this week. In English, the children have completed some absolutely fantastic double page spreads for their persuasive holiday brochures! They have included lots of powerful adjectives, alliteration and rhetorical questions. I think we have all been convinced to book a holiday to each of their amazing resorts. We have also focused on Science this week and have completed 2 experiments exploring states of matter. Can you explain to an adult how wind effects evaporation?

Year 5 - What a great start to the week having author, Nicholas Kasparis, visit the school to share his top tips for writing with all of the children. It was great to see Year 5 so engaged in what he had to say and seeing them implement this into their poems this week! Our zoo enclosures for Colchester Zoo are coming along well in our DT lessons and it has been great to see the children working together to fit the brief of what the enclosure really needs. Well done to all Year 5 students, who worked so hard on their assembly for you all yesterday. I am one very proud teacher and it was great to see how much they have learnt already this year! After half term we will be starting a new unit in Maths, 'position and direction.' Can you discuss with an adult at home about what a line of symmetry is?

Year 6 - This week, albeit short, the children have been busy writing narratives using speech, personification, and metaphors. They took inspiration from the author who visited our school on Monday, and I have been extremely impressed with them all. They have been creating their own artwork using pointillism (we have some budding artists in the class). I have given them all a SATs booster pack for the Easter holidays and would like them all to complete these as independently as possible. Please explain the meaning of 'census' to an adult and what information is collected for this.



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
