An important announcement for school lunches- especially for families in Year 3! Universal free school meals remain in place for all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. Therefore, those families who are eligible for benefit related free school meals in Year 3 (or above) need to register via the School Office. If you are unsure regarding eligibility, please come and see the office team. Even if you think you may not be eligible, DO apply because you (and the school) may be missing out on funding. Year 3 parents who are not eligible will obviously need to pay for school meals. On this note, we are encouraging children to bring in a 'healthy snack'. The infants are provided with a piece of fruit daily, so please encourage your children to try these. For more information about why we should encourage healthier snacks, and for ideas on what you can provide, please follow the link. Please be reminded that we do not allow nuts in school due to allergies. Children should also be provided with water bottles (with water in them) please.

Commitment from families is a vital component in our partnership and the start of the year is an appropriate time to remind you all about the importance of attending school every day, and arriving on time. Learning takes place from 08.30 and we look forward to every child being able to benefit from a full experience of school. I am sure most of you are aware that the Department for Education has issued new statutory guidance for attendance, called Working Together to Improve School Attendance. This came into effect on the 19 August 2024. It details what schools, parents/carers and Local Authorities should do to improve pupils' attendance at school. There are some important changes to attendance management from 19 August 2024, which will affect the support parents/carers and pupils receive from schools, and the legal sanctions that are used in certain circumstances. Please refer to our school policy which can be found on the website, for more information on this. Please ensure you look at the policy on the website, or speak to a member of staff if needed.

This year we will continue to share our daily reading figures with you, as reading is a life skill that helps to improve our future. The teachers track the number of children reading at home each week, and we are pleased to say that this is gradually starting to increase week on week, which is very positive. The children have been made aware of the importance that reading has and how it helps access all areas within the curriculum, and ultimately our life chances. It is essential that all children read daily for 10 minutes. Going forward, if we find that your child has not read once throughout the week, and that their Reading Record hasn't been signed by an adult at home, the children will read with a member of staff during their break or lunch time. Please help your children develop this life skill by listening to them read daily. Thank you for your support.
