Learning Links

Year R – This week in reception class, we have been starting to learn about our new topic: China. We already know that in China you might use chopsticks and celebrate Chinese new Year. The children have thought about what they would like to learn about China and decided upon the following: types of animals, Chinese dragons, Where is China and Chinese writing/language. We have been trying our hand at Chinese calligraphy and been learning how to play in our new roleplay areas: airport and Chinese restaurant. Do you have any links to China? Do you enjoy Chinese food? Please discuss with your child.

Year 1 -Welcome back! It is lovely to see all the children back in and ready to learn. We have started our new story in English which is the Julia Donaldson classic 'The Snail and the whale'. We will be learning all about what happens in the story and the characters. We will then plan and write our own versions. In maths we are taking a deeper look at numbers within 20 and learning our number bonds. Our History topic for this term is 'The History of Toys'. We will be looking at toys from the past and how they have changed. A quick reminder; there is homework set on Purple mash weekly. If you have any questions, please speak to Mr Webb.

Year 2 - Happy New Year! I know all the children are really excited to start our Spring term. We will be starting our new History topic which will be looking at flight. This will recap some areas the children learned about last year and also some new areas. In Maths, we are currently learning about money. At home you can support this by talking about the different coins and notes we use. Teaching money is becoming increasing difficult with the rise in contactless payments. So any conversations you have at home will greatly support your child's learning. In English, we have started a unit based on the story 'Hibernation Hotel'. We will eventually be writing our own versions of this lovely story.

Year 3 – This week we have been learning about the Romans, please try asking your children why the Romans invaded Britain. The children have really enjoyed recommencing their ukulele lessons and have shown a really positive start in their learning for this term.

Year 4 - Year 4 have come back to school ready to learn and have been working hard. We have started new topics across all of our subjects. In English we have been looking at a character description of the Jabberwocky, identifying and then using powerful adjectives and figurative language. In maths, we have been finding factor pairs and multiplying numbers by 10. Our new topic for science is digestion and food. We have looked at the human digestive system, identifying the body parts used and their functions. Can you tell an adult at home how we digest our food, using scientific language?

Year 5 - What a great week we have had in Year 5 to start off the new year nicely! We have started all new topics this week and the children have been really engaged and ready to learn. Our focus in English this week was figurative language and how it creates vivid images for the reader. The children will be using this language when they come to write their own adventure story in a couple of weeks time. We are recapping multiplication and division in Maths and I have really challenged the children by starting with long multiplication. Can you show an adult what methods you can use to solve the following question? 43 x 12 =

Year 6 – Year 6 have come back from the Christmas break with an outstanding attitude towards their learning. This week they have continued with ratio and fractions in maths and consolidating what they had learnt in the autumn term. In our reading lessons we have started a new book called 'Kensuke's Kingdom' and we have been looking at the language the author has used to create suspense. For writing they have been
